Aspiring young cricketing students have the opportunity to be part of a Specialist Cricket program. Successful selection in the Specialist Cricket Program means students will study cricket units throughout the year, receive professional coaching by qualified teachers and will have opportunities to be involved in regular organised competitions. Students will use a variety of forms of video and biomechanical analysis to assist in the development of their technical skills in batting. bowling and fielding. They play on turf wickets at various grounds and will have regular access to the WACA facilities.

Specialist Sport Program students have a unique opportunity to develop leadership skills and self-discipline and are expected to maintain a high level of endeavour in all learning areas, not only their chosen sport and are expected to participate in the wider College community.

The Specialist Cricket Program requires a commitment of four years (Year 7-10).
