<u>Applications must be received prior to trials</u> and are available online from the College website or from the College front office.

Auditions will be held, by appointment, on Saturday 18 May 2024 in the Music Department at John Forrest Secondary College.

Students will require the following items:

- Instruments and music as required.
- Students will need to present two contrasting pieces that show their ability and do a short aural skills test. Beginning students and those already learning an instrument privately (not through the IMSS program) will also be asked to sit a written musical aptitude test as part of the audition.

Applications must be received by Friday 10 May 2024.

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MUSIC SPECIALIST PROGRAM

(Approved by the Department of Education)

Auditions for ongoing students and testing for beginner students may be held by appointment. Students will need to present two contrasting pieces that show their ability and do a short aural skills test. Beginning students and those already learning an instrument privately (not through the IMSS program) will also be asked to sit a written musical aptitude test as part of the audition.

Commitment

The Music Specialist Program is a **four-year commitment**. It is expected that students enrolling in this course for Year 7 will participate until at least the end of Year 10. This is seen as an ongoing subject where students can learn their instrument from an early age, continue to develop musically and then have the choice of studying music in Year 11 and 12. The program includes:

- class music, which includes aural and theory skills, Kodaly ear training and composition;
- a weekly group instrumental lesson with an IMSS staff member; and
- two after school ensembles.

If your child is an out of area enrolment and you leave the Specialist Music Program this may result in cancellation of college enrolment.
