Bishop Street	Morley	Named after Mr H Bishop settled in area in 1920's. Active in Progress and Parents & Citizens Associations and his son saw action in World War I	17/01/1961
Boyle Place	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	17/04/1961
Bransby Street	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I with 11th Battalion	1/08/1958
Brisbane Street	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I, AG Barnes also early family in area owned dairy in Leake Street. Possibly named after City of Brisbane QLD as Melbourne Way & Ballarat Street are in close proximity as was Sydney Street	4/12/1959
Bromley Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in World War I	1/08/1958
Brooks Drive	Bayswater	Named after Messrs Harry & James Brooks for their contribution to the early development of the City. Mr Alfred William Brooks for his war effort at Gallipoli & the Middle East	20/09/1990
Burnett Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/08/1958
Cossom Place	Bayswater	Formerly part of River Road. Named after old identity of the district. Also family member W Cossom killed in action World War I	26/04/1968
Deschamp Road	Morley	Formerly known as Wolsely Road. Named after serviceman VC Deschamp killed in action World War I	
Dixon Street	Embleton	Named after Servicemen killed in action World War I, W Dixon & A Dixon died while on active service overseas with 28th Battalion. Also early family in the area	
Doherty Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman E Doherty killed in action World War I with 44th Battalion	1/08/1958
Driscoll Way	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	7/04/1961
Ellice Street	Morley	Named after serviceman G Ellice killed in action World War I. members of same family WC Ellice, HA Ellice & JR Ellice	1/08/1958
Fairs Street	Embleton	Named after Mr Fairs who came from Sussex in England in early 1800's and settled in area. Also member of family killed in action World War I; JE Fairs	1/08/1958
Feredy Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/08/1958
Forder Road	Noranda	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I N Forder. Also early family in area Clarence Forder was associated with early days of Baptist Church	
Grant Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/08/1958
Gummery Street	Bedford	Named after servicemen killed in action World War I. WH Gummery & CA Gummery	

Hawkins Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I. Also early family of district. Mr Henry Albert Osborne Hawkins JP was Member of Bayswater Road Board 1937 to 1951, Deputy Chairman 1937 to 1942 and Chairman 1942 to 1947	1/08/1958
Hewton Street	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in Action World War I	1/06/1957
Kemp Place	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in World War I, EW Kemp served with 51st Battalion	
Lawrence Street	Bayswater & Bedford	Named after Mr Stephen Lawrence born 1852 died 1934. Arrived in Bayswater 1902 and cleared land and built roads. Three sons served in World War I and fortunately all survived.	
Lennon Street	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/06/1957
Lindley Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/08/1958
Mallion Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I, T Mallion served with 51st Battalion	1/08/1958
Mansell Street	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/06/1957
Marriot Way	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	7/04/1961
McArthur Street	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	7/04/1961

Moran Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I - BJ Moran	1/08/1958
Nelson Street	Bedford	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I - IG Nelson	
Newell Way	Noranda	Named after Newell Family who were long time pioneer residents in Bayswater. Owned 12.5 acres in Embleton & lived on Collier Road around 1913. Also Named after serviceman killed in action World War I - J Newell	17/09/1960
Newton Street	Bayswater	Named after Mr FR Newton who was in South Australia Police Force, came to the district in 1888. Was killed in action in World War I	6/06/1962
Parsons Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/08/1958
Power Street	Embleton	Early pioneering family. Servicemen killed in action World War I - SGP Power, BS Power & AG Power served with 28th Battalion	1/08/1958
Priestley Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I - J Priestley	1/08/1958
Ramsden Way	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	7/04/1961
Rhodes Street	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	7/04/1961
Rowe Place	Noranda	Named after Mr Edgar Rowe Member of Bayswater Road Board 1916-1918 & 1924-1927 Chairman 1924-1926. Also named after serviceman killed in action World War I - RJ Rowe & WE Rowe Served with 11th Battalion	1/08/1958
Rumble Street	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I - H Rumble served with the 16th Battalion	1/08/1958
Sage Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/08/1958

Simmonds Street	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	7/04/1961
Smeed Street	Noranda	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I - LA Smeed. Also Smeed Family were early residents of Bayswater area. Mr Albert W Smeed & Mr William Leonard Smeed were florists in Bayswater in 1902. Mr William Leonard Smeed was also Postmaster for new post office in 1899 and Member of Bayswater Road Board 1898-1901, Chairman in 1901. Resigned 15 October 1901.	27/04/1971
Smith Street	Dianella & Morley	Named after servicemen killed in action World War I - BW Smith & W Smith	
Spruce Road	Morley	Named after servicemen killed in action World War I - HR Spruce, HF Spruce & EW Spruce who all served with the 16th Battalion. Also Amos Spruce Member of Bayswater Road Board 1918-1922 & 1924-1930	1/08/1958
Sudlow Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/08/1958
Thornton Street	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/06/1957
Thorpe Street	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/06/1957
Towning Street	Embleton	Named after servicemen from same family killed in action World War I - AFG Twoning, F Towning & WH Towning all served in 51st Battalion	01/008/1958
Uren Street	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/06/1957
Wade Street	Embleton	Formerly known as Kemp Street. Re-named Wade Street after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/11/1963
Ward Place	Embleton	Named after Mr John Henry Ward Member of Bayswater Road Board 1922-1923, 1924 & 1931-1936. Also named after serviceman killed in action World War I - J Ward	1/08/1958
Ware Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/08/1958
Westlake Road	Morley	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	7/04/1961
Whittock Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	18/06/1964
Wilde Street	Embleton	Named after serviceman killed in action World War I	1/08/1958
Wylde Road	Morley & Noranda	Named after old settler who lived in the area for 65 years. Also named after serviceman killed in action World War I - HW Wylde who served with the 16th Battalion	
Young Street	Bayswater	Named after servicemen killed in action World War I - IJ Young & A Young served with 51st Battalion
