YEAR 10, 11 AND 12 STUDENTS ARE LEARNING HOW TO PARTY



On 18 June Year 10, 11 and 12 students attended a talk in the college gym from a representative of The PARTY Outreach Program, a component of the Trauma Services Department at Royal Perth Hospital. This program is a trauma prevention initiative aimed at senior school students.

The Royal Perth Hospital Injury Prevention Nurse defined trauma as an injury that has been caused by physical force such as motor vehicle crash, falls and assaults and gave the students a snapshot of the possible traumatic and often

preventable consequences of risk related behaviour that can lead to injuries occurring.

A wheelchair road safety presenter from PBF (Australia) who sustained a spinal cord injury from a road crash also shared with the students life before her injury, how the injury occurred and the impact on her life and the lives of the people around her. It made students look at the consequences of unsafe road behaviour and ways to minimise the risk of being involved in a car accident.

The talk was well received. The students were engaged throughout the presentation and put forward some excellent questions at the end.

The following are comments made by some of the students:

"Getting my "Ps" soon and it has made me aware of the dangers."

"Will not get into the car with a novice driver."

"How easy it is to get a spinal injury."

Certificate II in Building & Construction commencing 2014

The John Forrest Secondary College and MPA Skills partnership are pleased to announce the introduction of a Certificate II in Building & Construction Course. This is in addition to the Plumbing & Gasfitting and Painting & Decorating courses already offered at the John Forrest Trade Training Centre.

The course will commence in 2014 and is aimed at Year 11 students interested in the construction industry. In Year 11 students will complete core training and work experience and in Year 12 will have the opportunity to specialise in brick and block laying, concreting, plastering, tiling, plumbing and gasfitting, painting and decorating and carpentry and joinery.

Work Experience and Try – A - Trade

THE WORLD OF WORK EXPERIENCE

The college was successfully able to place approximately 160 Year 10 students on work experience in the week 10-14 June. Work experience is the culmination of many weeks spent in the classroom exploring future career options and the "World of Work".

Students found themselves working in many and varied fields of endeavour. Some of these included: refrigeration and air-conditioning, teaching, engineering, physiotherapy, green keeping, furniture manufacturing, hairdressing, automotive, and the list goes on. We even had a student at the West Australian Museum.

The students generally find the idea of work experience to be quite confronting. They are used to the safe confines of the college and the fact that they had to report for "work" with total strangers was a thorough test of their "mettle". The week long program enables students to take a career for a "test drive" to "try before you buy". Having said that, it is also about gaining some general employability skills such as following instructions, using initiative, problem solving, working as a member of a team etc.

Parents and the broader college community deserve to feel very proud of the way that our students conducted themselves. I have received numerous complementary comments from employers about the conduct of our students and some have been offered casual and part time employment as well as offers of apprenticeships and traineeships.

Organising a program for this many students is a major task. Not many secondary schools choose to offer students in Year 10 this opportunity because of the costs involved. Our college sees the value of the program for our students and is prepared to invest considerable resources to ensure its success.

Below is the view on work experience from a student perspective:

The first time that we heard that we had to do work experience we didn't know what to think. Both nerves and excitement ran through our heads. As our first day arrived we didn't know that to expect from the big working world. We were both extremely nervous and overwhelmed by the things that we would be learning and becoming familiar with. The staff at our work placements were welcoming and guided us into a week of learning and adapting to working roles in both education and business.

Overall the week was very challenging and we learnt a lot of things. A greater amount of responsibility was required of us. We became more aware of the jobs that we want to do and the jobs that we may not want to do. Work experience gave us insight into doing full time work in areas that we thought could be a possibility in the future.

We would like to thank all of the Society & Environment teachers. We understand that organising work experience can be a very stressful and busy time. We would also like to thank Ms Gilgallon from SEITA for taking her time and effort to process and organise our placements with our employers.

Work experience was fun and we definitely recommend it to Year 10s in the future!
