## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

### A very successful Term 3

Many terrific examples of the extra activities, successfully conducted during Term 3 to enhance the opportunities and learning for our students, are highlighted in this edition of our newsletter. On behalf of our college community, I would like to thank and acknowledge the enormous commitment of our John Forrest Secondary College staff who are constantly involved in creating, planning and co-ordinating these activities and opportunities.

### Education Budget Cuts

As a member of the community, you would be aware, Western Australia has entered a period of fiscal constraint. The Government's decision to reduce the education budget has resulted in \$410,000 reduction in John Forrest Secondary College government funding. The college will continue with its current programs representing the distinctive college you, our community, supports. There will be some adjustments including a greater focus on electronic communication and a more rigorous application to class sizes through the timetabling process. Excursions/camps will be reviewed to minimise teacher relief expenses, where possible. I want to assure parents, the college will continue to offer our students a broad range of educational opportunities meeting their learning needs.

### Monday 14 October—normal school day

As an Independent Public School, John Forrest elected this year to set dates for School Development Days that fitted our planning and curriculum development needs. **The first day of Term 4 is a normal school day for John Forrest students and full attendance is required.**

### Year 12 students

As we head into Term 3 holidays, we know that our Year 12 students are preparing for the last weeks of their secondary careers, with many preparing for the final exams in November. We wish them well as they work to complete the final requirements for their WACE Certificates in the first weeks of Term 4.

## VISIT FROM YOUNG AUSTRALIAN OF THE YEAR

Akram Azimi is the current Young Australian of the Year for 2014 and he volunteered to speak to our senior students on 14 August 2013. Akram had the audience spellbound with his charming manner as he retold the story of his arrival in Australia as a refugee some 13 years ago from Afghanistan. He attended school in Australia, having very little command of the English language. He went on to be elected Head Boy of Warwick Senior High School, gaining an outstanding ATAR score and entrance into Law, Science and Arts at the University of Western Australia.

Akram explained how he spent time in a refugee camp in Northern Pakistan before his migration to Australia. He recalled seeing children around him suffering the after-effects of Polio. Luckily he had been given the Polio vaccine, which he later found out, had been funded by generous donations from the citizens of Australia.

Akram inspired the audience with his sincere desire to give back to his newly adopted country, to a country that had protected his health and who had invited himself and his family to make a home here. Akram works tirelessly with disadvantaged young people the length and breadth of this large state of ours. Akram is also mentoring a Special Olympics athlete to help raise community awareness of disability issues.

He encouraged our students to get involved as active citizens in making this great country of ours even greater. The vaccine that Akram received in the refugee camp cost 17 cents. He was living proof of what these donations to foreign aid projects can mean to truly disadvantaged and displaced persons.

The college concert bands both participated in the WA Schools Band Festival on Sunday 18 August, held at the new Churchlands SHS Concert Hall. The Junior Band draws from students in the surrounding primary schools as well as lower school students from John Forrest. They performed "Odyssey", "Hobbit Dance" and "Somebody I used to know" in the C Division. The Junior Band achieved a respectable "Merit" and received a recording of their performance as well as valuable feedback from the adjudicators. The Senior Band performed in the B Division and managed to take out an "Outstanding". ### Year 9 Francis Burt Law Courts Excursion

During the month of August the year 9 Society and Environment classes visited the Law Courts to view a court case. After we arrived in the city we separated into our class groups and met our leaders, Moira and Dean. Our group went to Supreme Court Gardens and entered the Francis Burt Law Centre which was the 3<sup>rd</sup> oldest building in Perth. We donned wigs and cloaks and prepared for the re-enactment of the trial of John Gavin, a fifteen year old boy accused of murder in 1844. We were all given different roles, such as the judge, ushers, witnesses, jury members and even the role of John Gavin. When it came time for the jury to deliberate, a unanimous decision could not be reached and a hung jury prevailed. The real John Gavin, was not as lucky as he ended up being hanged for his offence and remains the first European to be hanged in Western Australia.

The classes also attended a real sitting of a court case. Some classes attended the Magistrates' Court whilst others attended the District Court. We watched with awe as we had to go through security just as if we were at an airport. We waited nervously and excitedly outside the court room just waiting for the chance to see a real case. We were intrigued by the legal processes and the seriousness of all things that occurred in a court room. It made the information that we had learnt in class about court room roles and procedures come to life. It gave us an insight into the way the courts worked and what happens when someone breaks the law. Overall, it was a great experience to see how our legal system works and the importance of maintaining it. We all enjoyed the excursion and would like to thank our teachers and the court tour leaders who organised it for us.

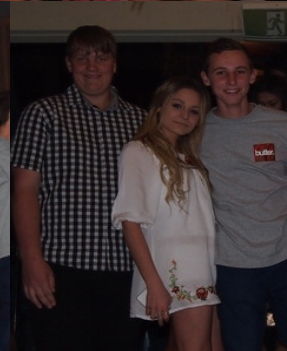
### YEAR 11 RIVER CRUISE
